US Offshore Sailing Championships. Southern Bay racer *Nanuq*, skipper **Glenn Doncaster** and crew **Jerry Latell**, **Matt Newborn**, **Sloan Burns**, **Hans Kalkofen**, **Bob Fleck**, and **Paul Wash**, sail *Nanuq* out of Fishing Bay Yacht Club. Glenn, who resides in Raleigh, NC, actually will represent Area D (southeast – NC thru FL). Two northern Bay racers, **Gus Ward** and **Laurent Givry** will both represent Area C (mid-Atlantic - VA thru PA). Southern Bay racer **Sledd Shelhorse** (Hampton Yacht Club, Virginia Beach, VA) and crew won the **1993 Offshore Sailing Championship** and brought home the Lloyd Phoenix Trophy.
